



Client Information Sheet: LIBRELA for Dogs

What is LIBRELA?

LIBRELA is a monthly injection used to control pain associated with osteoarthritis in dogs by reducing the effect of nerve growth factor (NGF).

What to Expect?

LIBRELA alleviates arthritis pain, but does not treat or reverse the condition. It may take two injections to see a reduction in pain. Consult your vet if the dog does not respond or stops responding.

Important Discussions with Your Vet:

- Risks and benefits of LIBRELA.
- Dog's medical history.
- All current medications.
- Previous monoclonal antibody therapy.

What can I expect from my dog's treatment with LIBRELA?



LIBRELA doesn't slow or reverse arthritis but can relieve pain for up to one month per injection.



It may take two injections (given one month apart) to notice a reduction in your dog's pain.



If your dog shows little improvement after the second injection or loses response over time, consult your vet about alternative treatments.



Before each injection, consult your vet to assess LIBRELA's effectiveness and decide if treatment should continue.



If your dog was inactive before treatment, consult your vet to create a safe exercise plan to prevent injury.

When to Avoid LIBRELA:

- Dogs under 12 months.
- Pregnant or breeding dogs.
- Dogs with new or changing health problems.

Possible Side Effects:

Balance problems, weakness, paralysis, seizures, increased drinking/urination, loss of bladder control, vomiting, or diarrhea. Contact your vet if you observe any concerning changes.


Works differently than NSAIDs
